• NEWTON BOARD OF EDUCATION UPDATE - Mrs. Cooke

Mrs. Cooke reported on the restart progress of the Newton Public Schools, the vote taken by the Board of Education on the Interim Business Administrator, Donna Snyder-DeVita. Status, and an update on school projects.

• PTA UPDATE – Mrs. Kelly-Jones

• BOARD PRESIDENT'S REPORT – Mrs. Bilik

Mrs. Bilik reported on several meetings she attended via Zoom for both Sussex and Warren County.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT – Dr. Furnari discussed the reopening plan for the district and how the plan would be enacted.

• There were two surveys sent out to assist in managing the reopening to best meet the educational, curricular, and safety needs of the district.

- About 1/3 of the student population, or 130 approximately, have chosen to be fully remote. The other students have been put into two Cohorts, A and B. There are some new families in the district that still need to be assigned, but that will be reviewed this week.
- All efforts were made to meet the communicated requests of families, daycare, carpooling, and transportation.
- Buses will not exceed 50% capacity to maintain appropriate social distancing requirements. This will allow modifications if families change the educational platform for their children during the time this hybrid model is used.
- September 3, 2020 is still the target date for reopening, however, the district must be ready to make changes at a moment's notice if direction from the CDC or State changes.
- Staff will have extra training
- This is a new realm for everyone, teachers, families, and administrative staff, but students will still be receiving a five-day learning week regardless of how the instruction is provided.
- Social emotional learning is being strongly reviewed to ensure students feel school is where they still want to be.
- Academic rigor will be maintained so students can complete a year's worth of learning.

Board of Education questions:

Mr. Guzzo – Will the structure used to organize the day be shared?

Dr. Furnari – Yes, as soon as scheduling is completed

Mr. Guzzo – Will there be testing of student learning at the start of the year?

Dr. Furnari – Yes, diagnostic assessment data will be gathered.

Mrs. Cooke – One-third of students will be remote; is there a noticeable cluster?

Dr. Furnari – Largest classes affected are the first and second graders

Ms. Post – If the district has to "flip/switch" will we share with parents?

Dr. Furnari – Yes. We need to preface the start model can change to 100% remote at any time; it is not the district's call. NJ DOE required all districts to prepare to "pivot" to remote instruction.

Mrs. Bilik – The Plan is on the website; what else will be added?

Dr. Furnari – FAQ's will be added; one for staff and one for families. Also any Department of Health updates, however, it must be noted that the public and school officials are receiving all information at the same time. That results in the school having little to no time to design a plan or develop many answers before parents/guardians ask valid questions.

- Dr. Furnari communicated to the Board of Education and those present that she, "is
 thrilled to announce JP Bollette as the district's Principal/Coordinator of Instruction".
 Mr. Bollette has proven himself to be a leader within the district and she believes he
 will be a great addition to the administrative team.
- There were 80 candidates in total. Eighteen were initially interviewed. There were six final candidates. Those finalists completed a much deeper interview including answering specific school related scenarios.
- BUSINESS ADMINISTRATOR/BOARD SECRETARY'S REPORT Mrs. Palecek The Annual Comprehensive Audit begins tomorrow by Nisivoccia, LLP. This is earlier than other years to allow maximum access to files while maintaining social distancing. Mrs. Palecek also met with the food service company, Maschio's to finalize the plan to reopen and provide lunches for eligible students.

School Alliance Insurance Fund Indemnity and Trust Agreement

THIS AGREEMENT, made this first day of July, 2020, in the County of Sussex, State of New Jersey, by and between the School Alliance Insurance Fund, hereinafter referred to as "Fund", and the Governing Body of the Green Township Board of Education hereinafter referred to as "Educational Facility";

WHEREAS, the Fund seeks to provide its members with insurance coverage; and

WHEREAS, two or more educational facilities have collectively formed a Joint Insurance Fund as is authorized and described in N.J.S.A. 18A:18B-1 et. seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Educational Facility has agreed to become a member of said Fund in accordance with and to the extent provided for in the bylaws of the Fund and in consideration of such obligations and benefits to be shared by the membership of the **Fund**;

Now, THEREFORE, it is agreed as follows:

1. The Educational Facility hereby agrees to become a member of the Fund for an initial period of three (3) years, the commencement of which shall coincide with the effective date of the Educational Facility's membership of the Fund.

- 2. The **Educational Facility** hereby ratifies and affirms the bylaws and other organizational and operational documents of the **Fund** as from time to time amended and altered by the Department of Banking and Insurance in accordance with the applicable statutes and regulations as if each and every one of said documents were executed contemporaneously herewith.
- **3.** The **Educational Facility** agrees to be a participating member of the **Fund** for the period herein provided for and to comply with all of the rules and regulations and obligations associated with said membership.
- **4.** The **Educational Facility** certifies that it has never defaulted on any claim if self-insured and has not been canceled for non-payment of insurance premiums for a period of at least two (2) years prior to the date hereof.
- 5. In consideration of membership in the **Fund**, the **Educational Facility** agrees that for those types of insurance in which it participates, the **Educational Facility** shall jointly and severally assume and discharge the liability of each and every member of the **Fund** all of whom, as a condition of membership in the **Fund**, shall execute a verbatim counterpart to this Agreement.by execution hereof the full faith and credit of the **Educational Facility** is pledged to the punctual payment of any sums which shall become due to the **Fund** in accordance with the bylaws thereof, this Agreement or any applicable statute or regulation.
- **6.** If the **Fund**, in the enforcement of any part of this Agreement, shall incur necessary expense or become obligated to pay attorney's fees and/or court costs, the **Educational Facility** agrees to reimburse the **Fund** for all such reasonable expenses, fees and costs on demand.
- 7. The **Educational Facility** and the **Fund** agree that the **Fund** shall hold all monies paid by the **Educational Facility** to the **Fund** as fiduciaries for the benefit of **Fund** claimants all in accordance with applicable statutes and/or regulations.
- **8.** The **Fund** shall establish and maintain Trust Accounts in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:18B-1 et. seq. and such other statutes and regulations as may be applicable.
- **9.** Each **Educational Facility** who shall become a member of the **Fund** shall be obligated to execute this Agreement.
- **10.** The **Educational Facility's** Business Official designated in the Resolution to Join shall be and is hereby authorized to execute the Agreement for membership.

Ms. Phillips, Phillips Road – How does a cohort work? If students are not in school are they learning? How will chromebooks be distributed?

Dr. Furnari: All students will be learning in whatever setting they may be assigned to. School is five-days each week; students will be learning each day. Mr. Bollette will be helping work out all of the components. Only the location for learning has changed. We are still working out the details for chromebook distribution.

Mr. McCormick, Forest Road – Will parents have answer keys for the curriculum? It is difficult for parents to assist their learners without a key. What is procedure for students with fevers?

Dr. Furnari: Entering into this new year we will be more prepared than in the spring. Parents will not be the teacher of record for their children. Any student or staff member with a temperature of 104° or higher will not be included in the school day. We have will have the ability to check individual temperatures as students and staff arrive to ensure this is followed. Anyone with a fever will remain in the isolation space within the school nurse's office. We will be following all CDC and Department of Health guidelines to determine how many days an individual must remain out of school. Again, the district has no control in how this type of situation is handled we must follow all guidelines.
