Dear Parents and Guardians,

The Green Township School District has launched an incredibly successful start of the school year! It is hard to believe that we have already completed the first 3 weeks of the year! Our students are doing remarkable things as they engage in meaningful learning experiences with their peers and teachers. As I visited various classrooms this morning, I saw our youngest learners working with letters and sounds and our oldest learners working with exponents and novels. The growth that occurs in our K-8 program is immense! Each grade level presents our students with wonderful opportunities to grow and learn. Many thanks to our parents, teachers, and students for making these first weeks such a success! Please find updates to a variety of areas included below.

**District Goals 22/23 School Year -** We are pleased to announce our district goals for the 22/23 school year.

- 1. Create experiential learning opportunities to enhance student growth.
- 2. Provide opportunities for excellent academic instruction to elevate student success.
- 3. Provide social and emotional supports to students and staff.
- 4. Increase district communication to all stakeholders and provide opportunities for community involvement.

**Transportation Update -** While there have been a great number of positive moments in these first weeks of the school year, transportation has been an area of constant concern. It has been such a challenge for our students and families to have delayed and inconsistent pick up and dismissal procedures. At this point we have waited for three weeks for this situation to improve with the bus company, and sadly we are still lacking adequate transportation for all of our students at dismissal on a regular basis. The issue that is causing these delays is bus driver shortages. On a regular basis First Student is contacting us in the morning to let us know how many buses we will be short for the day. When we are short a driver, we have to utilize double runs to transport our students. The double run requires the driver to complete their regularly scheduled run and then return to the school to complete a second run. The use of double runs delays the departure of students by 20-30 minutes.

We share in your frustration in this matter and continue to advocate for our students and families. District administration has met with the area general manager, local bus yard manager, and Sussex County Cooperative to express our significant concerns and frustration about the lack of consistency and timeliness in meeting the transportation needs of our school district.



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Additionally, I have publicly expressed our serious concerns at our Board of Education meeting to our board members.

As a result of the driver shortage, the bus company has increased their rate of pay, added incentives, and is actively hiring additional drivers to cover the needs of their fleet so that all buses can be running and on time. In the interim of awaiting these additional drivers, we have attempted to contact several other bus companies to see if we could arrange for an alternative solution until all 7 drivers are available to our district from First Student. Each of these bus companies have told us that they are either short staffed or do not have any additional routes available at this time. We are continuing to work with the bus company to determine other potential solutions to this serious issue.

We apologize for this situation. It is unacceptable for our students and families. We appreciate your understanding and support as we continue to navigate the driver shortage that has been impacting our transportation of district students.

**School Breakfast** – We are thrilled to be offering school breakfast after the bell each morning to our students. The cost of breakfast will be \$2.00 and will be enjoyed during homeroom.

**Extended Day Learning Academy** – The Green Township School District will be offering an extended day learning academy for identified students who are in need of targeted assistance in the areas of English Language Arts and/or Mathematics to reach grade level standards. The program will be offered to students in grades K-8. Permission slips will be sent out to students who may benefit from this additional support on Monday, September 26, 2022. **Parent Engagement Committees** – We are excited to announce a host of parent involvement activities for the upcoming school year.
